Extra Credît Opportunity #1, Fiesta del Jaguar

- You may do this assignment either by yourself or with any number of my students in any period up to three other people. (If you are in IA, you can go to the Jacksonville Zoo with up to three people in my 2A, 3A, 6B, 7B, or 8B classes in any combination.)
- Fiesta del Jaguar?
  - O What: An event that celebrates the Spanish-speaking countries of the world
  - O When: Saturday, Sept. 16
  - O Who: Everyone is invîted. Players from the Jacksonville Jaguars and Jacksonville Armada will be present!
  - O Where: Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens
  - O Why: For extra credit, but more importantly, for cultural awareness!
  - To receive your extra credit points (up to 100), you must submit the following:
    - O The other half of your zoo ticket.
    - Three pages of a Word Document file that includes: one photo each that showcases your experience at the Fiesta.
    - The photos must have you (your group, if any) in it so I know you actually went there! They must follow these criteria:
      - Photo #I must include an artifact or an object.
      - Photo #2 must include a food item.
      - Photo #3 must include the displayed name of a Spanish-speaking country's booth.
    - O Under each photo you must write a two to three sentences about it. Spanish I will write in English, while Spanish II will write in Spanish. It must include a description of the photo, your experiences about the subject, and something new that you learned about the people/objects in the photo.
    - O You may print and submit hardcopies, or you may e-mail me your Word Documents as attachments with the subject ECO #1, LAST NAME(S).
    - O Pro-tip: If you see me during the festivities, and take a selfie with me, you will get bonus points (up to 30)! I plan to be there from 12–3 p.m., but this is subject to change.
